In addition to the many prizes Bobbi has received whilst at MGGS, she has been awarded the prestigious Australian Mathematics Competition Medal and Prize four times, the University of Melbourne Mathematics Competition Outstanding Award 2002 and 2003, along with the 2003 MUPHAS Prize for Academic Excellence. At Speech Night, Bobbi received prizes for Excellence in English, Latin, Physics, Specialist Mathematics and The Winifred Waddell Memorial Prize for Mathematics.

Melbourne University Programme for High Achieving Students...

Melbourne Girls Grammar has been a centre for the teaching of first year university Mathematics since the MUPHAS (Melbourne University Programme for High Achieving Students) programme began in 1993. There have been outstanding results this year. Seven students from MGGS were part of a class of fifteen in which five MGGS students received first class honours: Jing Jing Guo, Nelu Jayawardena, Yi Dan Lin, Bobbi Ramchen and Wen Yi Tang.

In addition, Bobbi Ramchen received the 2003 MUPHAS prize for Academic Excellence awarded by the University of Melbourne.
